Questions for a successful partnership

Community partners should consider...

- Do you trust the researchers and believe they value your expertise?
- Will you be a true partner?
- Do you have the resources to be involved in the project or will you need funding from the researcher?

Both sides need to know the answers to these questions...

- How involved does the community partner want to be in the project?
- How does the community partner want the findings presented at the end of the project?
- What is your timeline or deadlines for the project?

Researchers should consider...

- Are you prepared to deal with the unique needs of the community partner?
- Will you need to provide training or resources to have the community partner take part?
- How integrated an approach do you want to take for knowledge mobilization?


